While the questions are important, remember your group's goal is to create an atmosphere that will foster true friendships. Use the discussion questions as you see fit but emphasize the relationships.

[Mark 4:35-41, ESV]

35 "On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, "Let us go across to the other side." 36 And leaving the crowd, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. And other boats were with him. 37 And a great windstorm arose, and the waves were breaking into the boat, so that the boat was already filling. 38 But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion. And they woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" 39 And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. 40 He said to them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" 41 And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

- 3. Putting yourself in the disciples' shoes, how do storms help us understand the nature of God more? Why do some of the greatest storms sometimes come after great obedience?
- 4. Why does revelation start with an invitation?
- 5. What promises has God spoken for your life to take you to a new place? Where do you think He intends to take you?
- 6. Why do the Lord's promises always require a step of obedience? Why does it typically mean separating from the crowd around you and following Jesus?
- 7. Why is staying in the boat with Jesus during the storm important?
- 8. What is your next step of faith?
